This month marked the kick-off of the Miami Convention & Visitors Bureau/Miami Regional Chamber of Commerce "Miami Matters" campaign. This partnership program is designed to promote Miami and encourage people within the community to share unique things about Miami and Ottawa County with visitors that come into our area.

"Miami Matters" is important because it creates opportunities for tourists to spend dollars locally that result in sales tax revenue which can fund improvements; such as roads, recreational opportunities, future improvements, and G.A.R. Cemetery improvements.

You may be surprised to know that Oklahoma is the only state that municipalities depend on sales tax as their sole source of revenue. This is unique from municipalities in other states, which receive revenues from varying sources such as property tax.

G.A.R. Staff is ready to promote the "Miami Matters" campaign. We have many visitors to the cemetery office each year doing genealogical research. Office Manager Nancy Bro attended the "Miami Matters" training this week and is more informed to let visitors know about opportunities in our community.

This includes the British Flyers, Cal Campbell (who was shot and killed by Bonnie and Clyde), John Beaver (who was a Second Chief of the Quapaw Tribe), and Mutt and Lovell Mantle (who are the parents of Mickey Mantle).

he City of Miami, G.A.R. Cemetery cordially invites the public to their annual Memorial Day Ceremony to be held on Monday, May 29th, at 2801 North Main, Miami, OK 74354. The ceremony will take place at the Historical G.A.R. Monument located at the south end of the cemetery. You can access this location by entering the southernmost gate entrance.

This year the Ceremony will begin at <u>9:00 a.m.</u> G.A.R. Cemetery Director; Kim Horn, reflected that the new time that was implemented (2) years ago has worked well for all who attend, and stated that immediately following the ceremony, Brown-Winters Funeral Home will be serving refreshments in the gazebo.

Participants this year are: the American Legion (Post #147); Marine Corps League (Northeastern Oklahoma Detachment); the 4 State Friends of Veterans; David Rountree, City of Miami and Associate, Piper for the City of Tulsa Pipes and Drums, will perform a patriotic ensemble and *Amazing Grace*; Amanda Cole, Joplin High School Music and Band Director will be the bugler, and her Special Choir, from Joplin High School, will sing our National Anthem, "The Star-Spangled Banner".

We are honored to welcome this year's guest speaker, Third Class Petty Officer, AZ3 Carol Larkin. Ms. Larkin served in Naval Aviation Administration. Her last duty station was NAS Oceana Virginia with the Grim Reapers Air Squadron VF 101, and, she received the National Defense Metal in 1974 for service during the Vietnam era.

The Flag Ceremony will be conducted by local area Boy Scout, Mason Compton, Troop #50. Mason has been working on his Eagle Scout badge, and approached G.A.R. Cemetery about working on a project to map out Veteran's Markers. He spent several months doing this with the help of some volunteers and has completed 17 blocks in the oldest part of the cemetery. This consisted of covering an area of 2,596 graves.

This year, like year's past, the local Scout Troops will organize the Scouts and volunteers to help with the placement of approximately 3000 flags upon Veterans graves over Memorial Day weekend. Cemetery Office Manager Nancy Bro stated, "These boys and girls always do an amazing job placing the flags upon our Military Veterans graves. Their spirit and enthusiasm is contagious, and I always look forward to this event. We also want to inform the public that the cemetery office always has extra flags available year around for their use."

We at G.A.R. would also like to thank Vietnam Veteran, Melvin Cook for the donation of 144 flags to help with our annual flag placement event, and Jerry Cole for being here every year to hand out small flags to all who attend our Ceremony.

The G.A.R. Legacy

Byack Lao Gal Rei

PFC Leonard E Eulitt

Birth: December 15, 1943

Death: February 9, 1968

Vietnam War

Thua Thien-Hue province

BURIAL: 3/1/1968

Leonard Eulitt was just 24 years old when he died in battle during the Vietnam War. He was a Private First Class E3, and was in the Light Weapons Infantry for the Army, Selective Service. C CO, 2ND BN, 12TH CAVALRY, 1ST CAV DIV, USARV.

On January 12, 1968 Leonard began his short military career, and less than a month later he lost his life during a battle that took place in South Vietnam in the province of Thua Thien.



"On 9 February, the 3d Brigade commander instructed Colonel Sweet's battalion on Nha Nhan to probe Thon La Chu from the south. As the 2d Battalion, 12th Cavalry, moved out that morning, accompanied by the South Vietnamese platoon from the hill outpost, the men encountered a squad of well-camouflaged snipers and at least one spotter at the base of the hill. North Vietnamese bullets and mortar fragments killed two Americans and wounded twelve others before a team of cavalrymen outflanked the enemy, killing at least three of the sharpshooters.

More trouble lay ahead. As the unit was crossing a rice field that led to the village of Thon Bon Tri, a small wooded settlement fifteen hundred meters south of Thon La Chu, a battalion or more of North Vietnamese opened fire from the tree line. The Americans quickly lost another two men killed and ten wounded. Unable to advance and with darkness fast approaching, Colonel Sweet decided to pull his unit back to the woods at the foot of Nha Nhan for the night."



DECORATION REMOVAL DATE First Monday in February 02/06/2017 **Second Monday Following Easter** 04/24/2017 First Monday Following Memorial Day 06/05/2017 First Monday in October 10/02/2017

- Wrought iron basket hangers are not permitted except for the time period of December 15th through January 15th and one week prior to Memorial Day until the first Monday following Memorial Day.
- Notices for our decoration removal schedule will be posted on signs at cemetery entrances the week preceding decoration removals.
- All decorations not collected by date and time listed will be disposed of with no exceptions.
