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Flyer's Body Exhumed

The body of the cadet from the Miami air field, was taken from the ground about 11 o'clock Monday night. The engine was buried about 10 feet underground and the body was under it. Farmers working near the scene of the accident say that the plane nosed straight downward and buried the engine and the pilot in the center of a bean field. Hundreds of people from far and near went to the scene during the day. Those who first arrived were permitted to go to the place where the engine was buried but later in the day the crowd was held back to about the distance of 300 feet, but the spot of the accident was in full view. Officers from the Miami flying field were on the spot as quickly as they could get here, and worked unceasingly until they had the body. The Red Cross ambulance came up also from the Miami field. The unfortunate cadet was from England, and had been making solo flights for several months. The accident happened on what is known and the Henson farm, but is occupied by Cleo Mosler and family.
